Objectives of the Course	: This course is a survey of the history of modern Turkey. Our investigations will begin with the final two centuries of the Ottoman Empire, which is often defined as "modernization" period. After surveying this period in comparison with the major developments that were seen in contemporary Europe, we will pass on to the destruction of the Ottoman Empire during the First World War (1914-1918) and the period immediately following it, encompassing the Turkish war of independence (1918-1923) and the creation of the Turkish Republic.					
Course Contents	: Introduction to fundamental concepts of history as a discipline, various reasons contributed to demise of the Ottoman Empire, major developments that are observed in Europe during the eighteenth and nineteenth centuries, modernization attempts in the Ottoman Empire, reasons and consequences of the great war (1914-1918), the period leading to the foundation of modern Turkish Republic (1919-1923) constitute the main themes that are discussed in this course.
